



### **Community Inclusion**

**Community inclusion is the opportunity for a person to live in the community of their choice:** 

- as a contributing member of the community;
- while being valued for one's abilities and uniqueness — regardless of disability; and
- at the same level as a nondisabled person.

#### We each play a role:

- building partnerships to support a person to create a life and be part of a community; and
- creating housing opportunities that also make a house a home.



#### **Why Community Inclusion Matters**

As Ginsburg wrote in the *Olmstead v. L.C.* decision "segregating people with disabilities severely diminishes [their] everyday life activities...including family relations, social contacts, work options, economic independence, educational advancement, and cultural enrichment".

Clearly institutions segregate people but without support for "everyday life activities...including family relations, social contacts, work options, economic independence, educational advancement, and cultural enrichment" segregation can continue in the community.


