Federal Opportunities

FTA Announces \$343 Million in Grants to Modernize Older Transit Stations and Improve Accessibility

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) <u>announced that eight transit systems in eight states</u> will receive funding to help make it easier for people with disabilities and mobility needs to access some of the nation's oldest and busiest rail transit systems through essential upgrades, such as elevators.

99 Communities Selected for SS4A Grants; Still Accepting Applications

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced over \$63 million in grants from the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program. The funding will go directly to 99 local, regional, and Tribal communities to improve road safety and help prevent deaths and serious injuries on their roads. The program is still accepting applications and funds remain for the third and final round of awards.
