- Largest non-profit provider of homedelivered meals in the state of Iowa.
- WesleyLife has operated Meals on Wheels for 18 years.
- Nearly 2,000 hot, nutritious meals a day to older adults and veterans in Polk & Dallas counties.
- A major differentiator: homedelivered meals; our safety checks connect participants, improve wellbeing, and save lives.




Who We Serve

- Food Insecurity
 - 80% of clients live at/below 185% of federal poverty rate (\$27,000/year fixed income).
- Social Isolation
 - 43% of older adults feel lonely. 69% of those we serve live alone; most are women. Average client age is 76.
- Well-Being
 - Reduces hospitalizations by an average of 39%.
 - Since 2016, wellness checks have saved 3-7 lives a year.

About our Farm




- 3,000+-square-foot indoor farm growing leafy greens to support WesleyLife's meals




